Paul's Letter to The Ponans

The Letter to the Romans was written by the Apostle Paul to the Christian churches in Rome. His letter talks about both God's judgment of sin and his saving mercy. There was probably some tension between the Jewish believers and gentile believers within the Roman Church when Paul wrote this letter. Paul addresses both groups through this letter as an effort to unify them through the gospel. Today we see many divisions in the church similar to the Roman Church where does the "law" end and grace begin, where does grace fit in with the "law." Do we throw out the "law" and only live by grace, or are we supposed to keep certain aspects of the "law?" As we read through Romans we can get a better understanding of how the gospel impacts our lives and how we should live as believers in this world.

- What does this mean?
- What does this passage have to do with Christian Unity?
- What is (or should be) my response to what I've learned?
